

She is also expanding her restaurant and building a new company, Sheba Farms, which will process, mill and package teff flour. She's already off to a good start. Early this year, Taddese and teff agronomist Tareke Berhe successfully approached University of California Davis about researching the best way to start growing teff in California. Any advances made in the process of making teff at UC Davis will be shared with farmers in the U.S. and Ethiopia. A more efficient variety of teff will nearly double the yield for




The Democratic Republic of Congo is notorious for having a difficult and opaque development setting. While the government has taken steps to ease the burden of entering the Congolese environment through the creation of a one-stop registration agency (Guichet Unique de Creation d'Enterprise), the actual implementation of projects remains challenging.

Enter Ascenseur Congo, an organization that offers pre-emptive solutions for those looking to engage an underdeveloped, in some cases non-existent, market in a variety of sectors. Our capacity building programs have social capital and skills enhancement components as the foundation for infrastructure development. Our programs address good governance, social capitol, better business practices, mentoring, internships, skills development and educational exchanges. In addition, after speaking with investors and donors throughout North America, Europe and Asia, a reoccurring complaint is the difficulty of finding specific data about the incountry investment environment and process.
